NIH Title 5 and Title 42 Federal Employees Only: *

NIH Child Care Subsidy Program is always taking applications. Applications can be submitted online. If you are wondering if you qualify, check Line 11 of your most recent IRS Tax Form 1040 for your Adjusted Gross Income. If your adjusted household income is less than \$100,001, you may be eligible to receive up to \$5,000 in subsidy reimbursements. If filing separately, both spouses' AGI will be combined. NIH Federal Employees and Trainees/Fellows Only:

NIH Back-up Care Program is available nationwide for in-home and center-based childcare, self-care, and in-home adult care. Free of charge registration required; there is a cost of care to use the program (up to 10 days of care in a calendar year). Includes virtual tutoring and virtual camps for school-age children.
