- SUBJECT: Undergraduate and Masters level Special Volunteers Not Permitted in the NIH Visiting Program

Policy Statement

- Special Volunteers in the NIH Visiting Program must meet the same degree requirements as trainees in the <u>NIH Visiting Fellow Program</u> (see section D, part 1 'Eligibility'). Specifically, foreign national Special Volunteers must either:
 - Have completed a doctoral or equivalent terminal degree program, or
 - Be enrolled in a doctoral or equivalent terminal degree program

Background

- All <u>Intramural Research Program (IRP) scientists</u> who are foreign nationals defined here as neither U.S. citizens nor lawful permanent residents are considered NIH Visiting Program participants and must comply with the requirements and spirit of the NIH Visiting Program.
- The NIH Visiting Program does not permit foreign national pre or postbaccalaureate trainees.

Implementation

- Effective immediately, DIS will process a Special Volunteer request <u>only if</u> the foreign national scientist meets degree requirements stated above.
- Requests submitted to DIS for foreign national Special Volunteers who do not meet above degree requirements will be canceled.
- Institutes/Centers may wish to consider contractor positions for foreign national scientists who do not meet above requirements and who are not eligibile for any other <u>IRP designation</u>.
