

Procedures for Occupational Injuries or Exposures

- 1** Immediately initiate first aid at the worksite.
- ▶ Wash contaminated skin and wounds thoroughly with soap and water for 15 minutes.
 - ▶ Irrigate contaminated eyes and mucous membranes for 15 minutes using an emergency eyewash, normal saline solution, or water.
 - ▶ For chemical inhalation exposure, move the person to fresh air.
 - ▶ For medical emergencies, call 911 or go to the closest emergency room and have someone notify OMS on your behalf.

2 Report to Banner Occupational Health Clinic once first aid is complete at the worksite.

- ▶ For injuries or exposures that require immediate attention that occur at work on holidays, weekends, afterhours, such as exposure to biological or chemical hazards, including human or animal body fluids or tissues, infectious agents, toxins, or any serious injury requiring hospitalization, please call or have someone call on your behalf, the **Clinical Center Page Operator at 301-496-1211** and ask them to page the OMS provider on-call immediately

Notify the CDSO, your supervisor, and OMS as soon as possible.

All workplace injuries, illnesses, and hazard exposures must be reported to OMS. You, or someone on your behalf, may report work-related health concerns anytime. For documentation purposes, this is done using the myCority application (accessible only on the NIH network at <https://orsp-cority1.ors.nih.gov/mycority>). OMS monitors myCority only during business hours (M-F 7:30am - 5:00pm).
