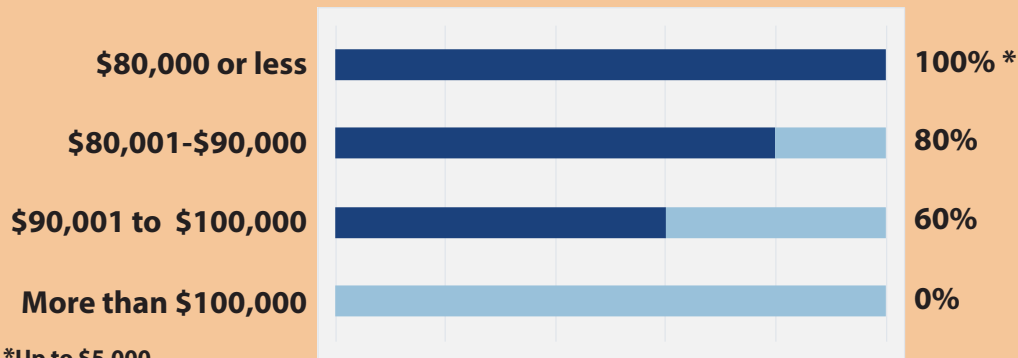
Do you need assistance paying for licensed child care?

Adjusted Household Income

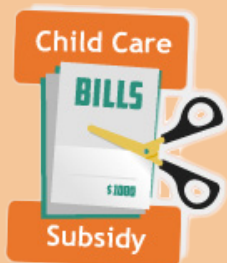
*Program will pay percentage of weekly subsidy reimbursement



*Up to \$5,000

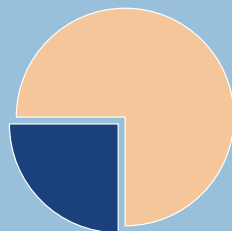
Program eligibility based on total household income of less than \$100,001*, based on most recent IRS Form 1040, 1040A, or 1040 EZ Adjusted Gross Income.
*If filing separately, AGI from both spouses' tax returns are combined.

Did you know?



Last year, almost 30% of program participants had total household income of \$80,001 to \$100,000. Applications accepted year-round.



The childcare subsidy can be used for children under 13 or, if disabled, under 18, and enrolled in licensed childcare. Subsidy paid directly to childcare provider.



The childcare subsidy program serves single- and dual-income families.
